First EGEE-II project review report

The project recently received the official report on the first EGEE-II review, held in May this year. The report rated the project in the highest category, "good to excellent project". To quote the cover letter sent with the report, "the overall outcome of the review was positive and the reviewers acknowledge the progress made by the project in this first year. All the deliverables submitted in this reporting period are accepted." The reviewers also made several important recommendations for all activities, which the project must now address and respond to by 31 July, highlighting how this affects the activity plans for the second year of the project. These answers will be formulated at an All Activity meeting on 5-6 July at CERN, in which the activity managers will discuss the recommendations.
